

DESCRIPTION OF MAP UNITS

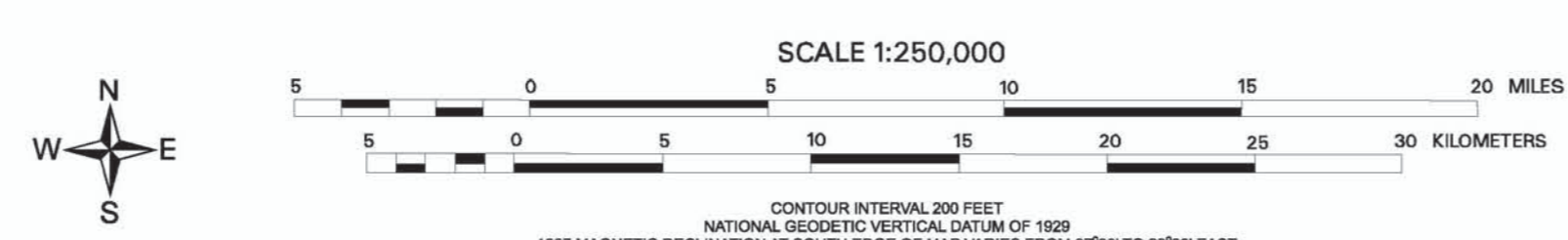
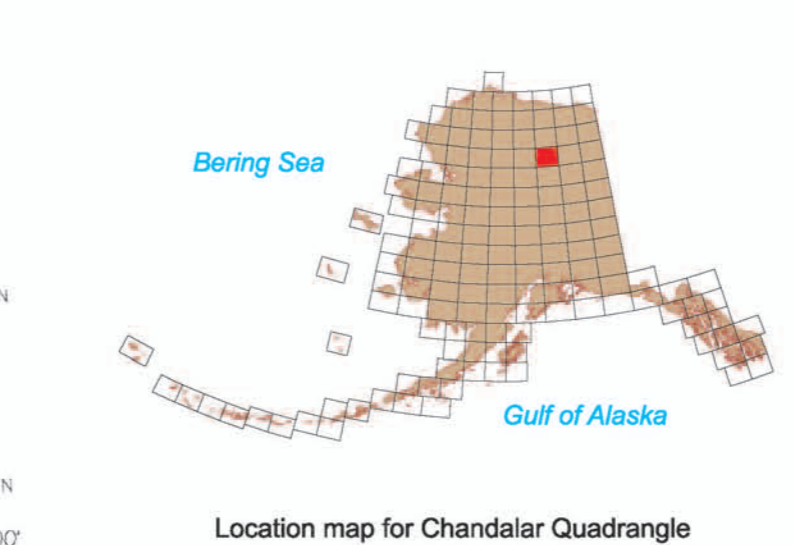
- Snow avalanches - Significant potential for snow avalanches based on the presence of steep topography.
- Naleds - Area susceptible to winter buildup of thick seasonal icing sheets (naleds).

PERMAFROST

Perennially frozen ground is transitional from continuous to discontinuous in this quadrangle.
