

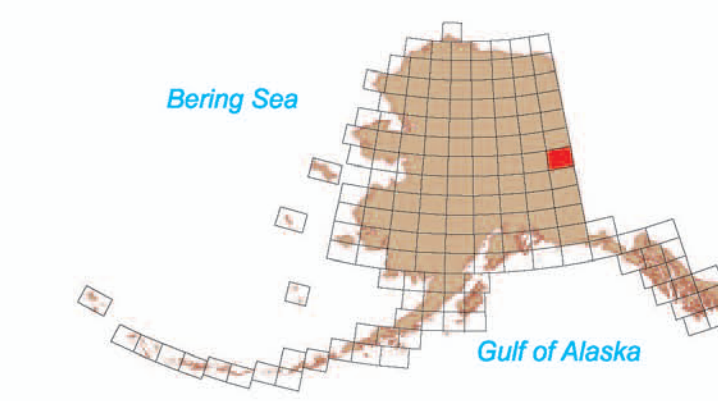
DESCRIPTION OF MAP UNITS

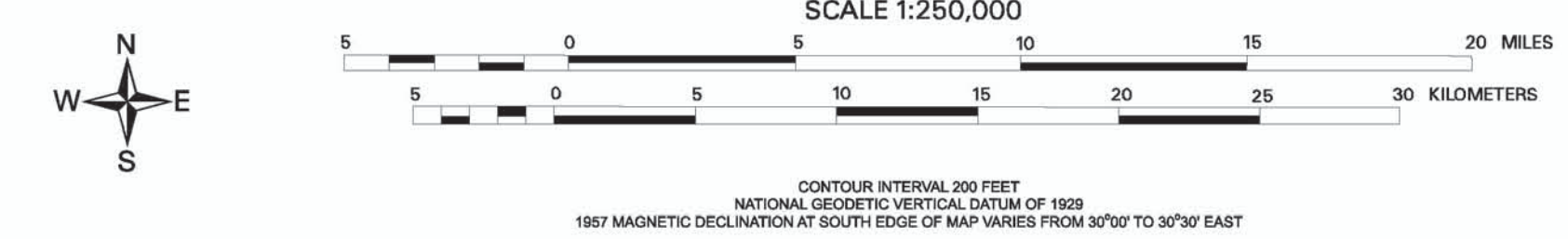
