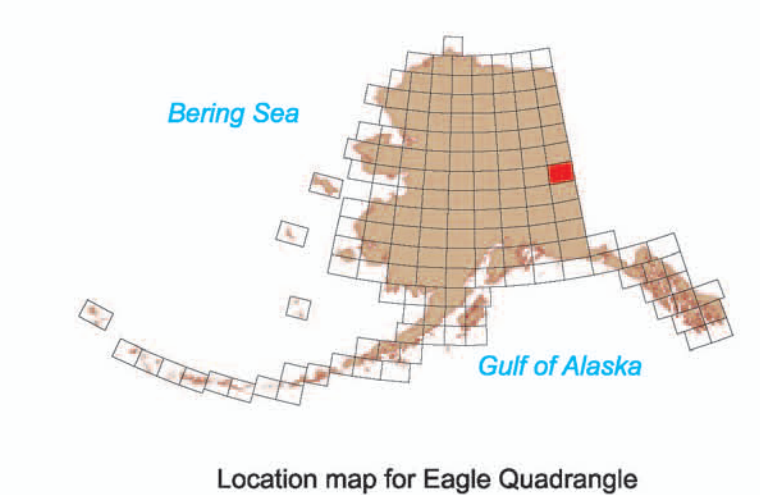


**DESCRIPTION OF MAP SYMBOLS**  
 --- Definitely active fault - Clear evidence of movement during the past 10,000 years; solid where location is known, dashed where approximately located, dotted where inferred.

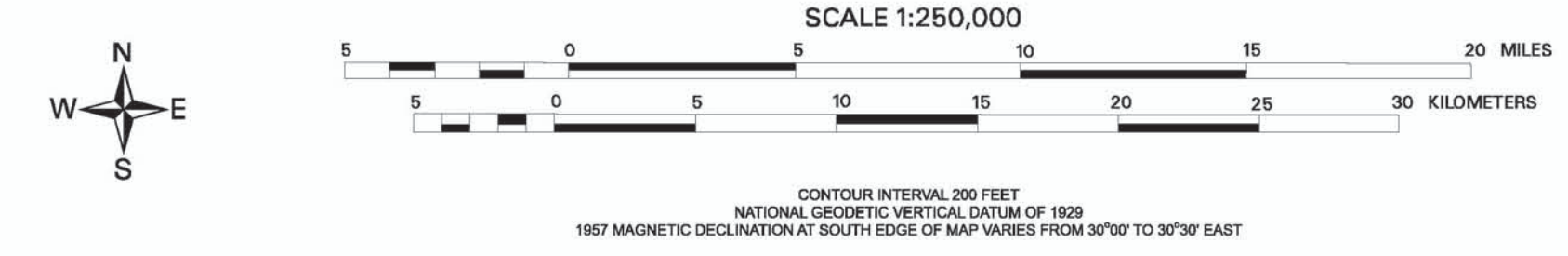
**PERMAFROST**
