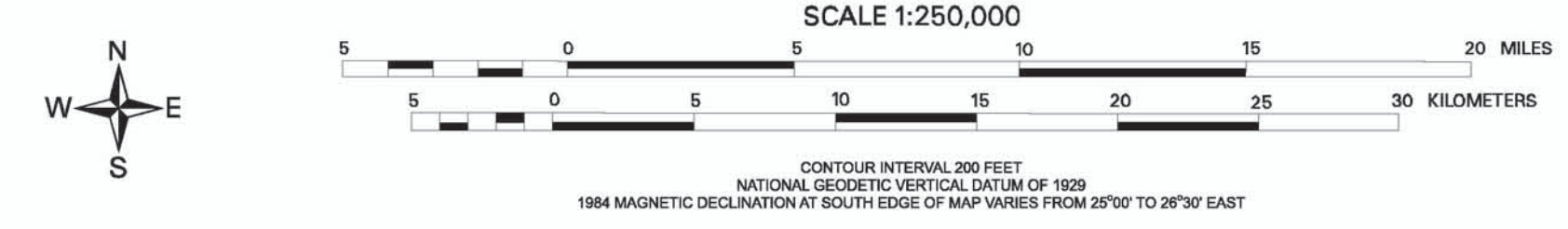
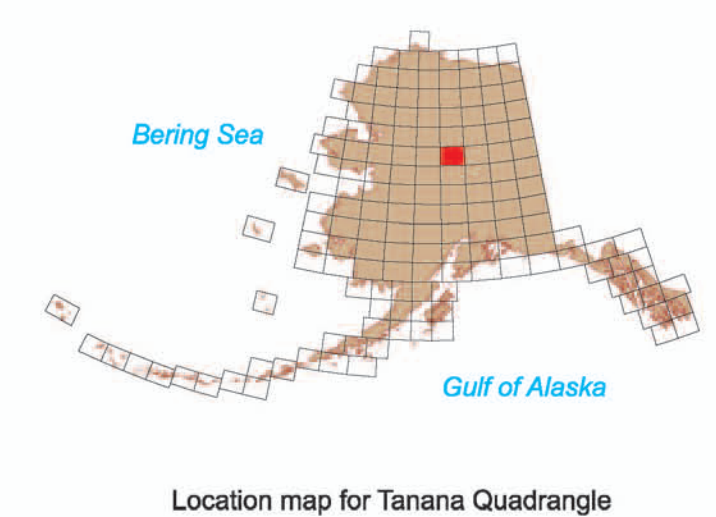


- DESCRIPTION OF MAP UNITS**
- Significant ground-ice content
 - Significant liquefaction potential and seasonal flooding
 - Rapid mass movements, seasonal flooding, and snow avalanching
 - Hazards possibly present but unknown
 - No identified hazards
