Circular areas are 10 kilometers (6.2 miles) in diameter; numbers are keyed to the accompanying reference list.

About 21,017,000 fine ounces of placer gold was produced from Alaska between 1880 and 1979. Approximately two-thirds of this came from the area near Fairbanks and Seward Peninsula.
