- Directs federal land management agencies to standardize and digitize recreational access information and make it available to the public.




Establish the Process






- Follows the data standard from inception to implementation
- Recommends a timeline that reflects the workload and effort
- Improves support with review periods and deliverables that allow for realistic testing




Establish Core Fields



- Designed to facilitate the data standard development process
- Serves as a starting point and minimum requirement
- Provides a structured framework for documenting feature metadata
- Provides consistency across all data elements

Apply the Core Fields to each Data Element






Collect Agency Standards

- Distribute Draft for Agency Review






MAPLand Act Next Steps

Deadline	Task	MAPLand Act
April Annually	 Submit progress report to Congress 	Section 7
October 2024 (30 months)	 Jointly develop interagency spatial data standards and ensure compatibility among databases for dissemination For Recreation Sites (element #1?) that depict locations where recreation is available to the public (under review by Departments) 	Section 3
April 2026 (4 years)	 Publish Easements and Less-than-fee Interests (element #2) in private land that provide public recreational access to federal land 	Section 4
April 2027 (5 years)	 Publish Roads (element #3) and Trails (element #4) that are open/closed to specific vehicle classes Publish Hunting and Shooting Boundaries (element #5) that are regulated/closed 	Section 5
