On June 26, 1955, Bruce Thomas of the U. S. Bureau of Mines end I made a search for the Gill lead-silver prospect. Our attention was brought to this prospect by the following quotation on page 217 in USGS Bulletin 844-D, MINERAL DEPOSITS OF THE RAMPART AND HOTSPRINGS DISTRICTS, ALASKA by J. B. Mertie, Jr:

*It is of interest, however, to record the fact, reported to the writer by M. S. Gill of Eureka Creek, that several years ago a lead-silver deposit was found by a prospector in the headwaters of either Eureka or Pioneer Creeks. Two assays of the sulfides are said to have shown 100 ounces of silver to the ton and 70 per cent of lead.

One of the long-time residents in the district told Bruce Thomas that the Gill prospect was located on the ridge between Eureka and Pioneer Creeks. In June 1955, Bruce was in the district supervising a drilling progrem for the Bureau of Mines, and I was there to examine a prospect. We made an unsuccessful one-day search for the Gill prospect around the head of Eureka Greek starting on the ridge between Mureke and Pioneer Creeks. The accompanying map shows the route that we followed. drove to the Isaacson placer camp on upper Eureka Creek and began our search from there. The higher parts of the ridges along the route are above timberline so that a dump or excavation of appreciable size would be conspicuous and could be seen at a distance, however, on the lower slopes, trees and brush would hide the prospect unless it had a very large dump or a building standing nearby.
