

DESCRIPTION OF MAP SYMBOLS


J Jokulhaups - Area prone to large-magnitude floods due to sudden drainage of glacier-dammed lakesupstream (jokulhaups).

PERMAFROST

Perennially frozen ground is transitional from discontinuous to sporadic in this quadrangle.


