

INFRASTRUCTURE-TRAILS

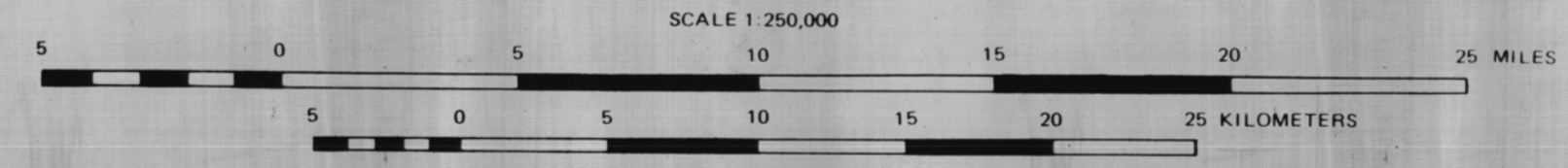
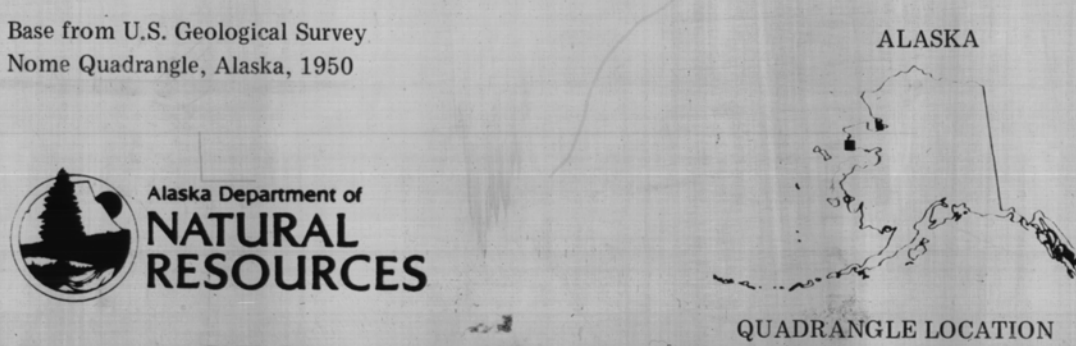

Other trails are labeled with a letter code indicating the source.
